

DMDK joins DMK alliance, may get 1 RS, 6 MLA seats

PUTTING an end to weeks of political speculation, the Desiya Murpokku Dravida Kazhagam (DMDK) on Thursday formally joined the DMK-led Secular Progressive Alliance (SPA) after being assured of one Rajya Sabha seat and six Assembly seats.

The development comes a day after the Election Commission of India (ECI) announced that biennial elections to 37 Rajya Sabha seats, including six from Tamil Nadu, will be held on March 16. Of the six outgoing members from the state, four belong to the DMK—Tiruchi Siva, N R Elango, Andhiyur Siva, and Dr Kanimozhi NVN Somu.

Sources in the DMK said the party had already committed one Rajya Sabha seat to the Congress and has now offered one to the DMDK. “The six constituencies to be allotted to the DMDK will be finalised by a committee to be formed by the DMK leadership. The alliance was sealed only after the number of seats was confirmed and accepted by both the sides,” a senior DMK leader told *TNIE*. DMDK general

secretary Premalatha Vijayakanth and party treasurer LK Sudish met Chief Minister and DMK President MK Stalin at the party headquarters, Anna Arivalayam, in Chennai, formally joining the alliance. Senior leaders from both parties, including Deputy Chief Minister Udhayanidhi Stalin and DMK deputy general secretary Kanimozhi Karunanidhi, were present.

The DMDK has never previously aligned with the DMK and

had, at various times, partnered with rival alliances. This marks the first time the party has joined hands with the DMK.

Welcoming the DMDK, Stalin said the “bond of goodwill would continue to contribute to the progress and prosperity of Tamil Nadu”. Recalling alliance talks held in 2016, she said the tie-up had materialised after a decade-long delay. “It should have happened when Captain Vijayakanth was alive. It is happening after a delay of 10 years, and we will work to ensure the alliance wins more than 200 seats,” she said.

Vijayan slams ‘Kerala Story 2’ as ‘hate-mongering’

KERALA Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan on Thursday termed ‘The Kerala Story 2’ as a “hate-mongering film” and said the release of its sequel should be seen with “utmost gravity”.

In a post on social media platform X, Vijayan said, having seen through the alleged communal agenda and blatant lies in the first part, “Kerala will once again reject this attempt to demonise our secular fabric with contempt.”

“It is shocking how fabricated narratives aimed at inciting communal discord receive a free pass, while critical expressions of art get gagged. We must stand united against these attempts to paint our land of harmony as a hub of terror: The truth shall always prevail,” he said on X.



The BJP has come down heavily on Vijayan over his remarks opposing the movie, accusing him of “hypocrisy” and attempting to distract people from governance issues ahead of elections.

Speaking to reporters in Delhi on Thursday, BJP state president Rajeev Chandrasekhar trained his guns on the CM and asserted that filmmakers have the right to creativity and citizens have the right to decide what they watch. Chandrasekhar alleged that the chief minister was portraying

HC notice to CBFC on plea to quash certification

The Kerala High Court on Thursday issued notice to the Central Board of Film Certification and the producers of the film ‘The Kerala Story 2: Goes Beyond’ in a petition seeking to quash the certification granted to the film. The court issued the order on a petition filed by Sreedee Namboodiri of Kannur. The petitioner also sought to suspend the exhibition and release of the film. The petitioner argued that the certification was granted without adequate examination of its impact on public order, decency, and morality, as mandated under Section 5B of the Cinematograph Act, 1952. The concluding statements in the teaser and trailer allegedly amount to a call for retaliatory action, creating a real and imminent apprehension of law and order issues. **ENS**

Accusing Pinarayi of double standards, Chandrasekhar said he used a different yardstick when a Hamas leader gave an online address at a pro-Palestine event in Malappuram in 2023. Asserting that “love jihad” was not a fiction but a reality,

Chandrasekhar said the chief minister wants to ignore it.

BJP leader Sobha Surendran said that though she has not seen the movie, the title of a film cannot be questioned as “we cannot violate the freedom of expression”. Speaking at a press conference here, she said that some women have escaped from the chains, and there are some who should be brought to the light by the media.

SABARIMALA GOLD THEFT

‘Not an iota of evidence against thantri’

IN a big blow to the SIT probing the Sabarimala gold theft case, the Kollam Vigilance Court has ruled that investigators failed to produce “an iota of evidence” to establish a prima facie case against thantri Kandararu Rajeevaru.

The court had granted bail to the thantri on Wednesday, 41 days after he was arrested by the SIT in the cases registered for theft of gold from the door frames as well as dwarapalaka idols. The court, in its bail order, said the SIT was unable to establish “any prima facie materials to link the petitioner in the alleged conspiracy by any means”.

It stated that the act of the

thantri in not signing the mahazars on May 18, 2019, and July 20, 2019, would destroy the entire case of the SIT regarding criminal conspiracy. The mahazars were prepared after the gilded sheets from the door frames and dwarapalaka idols were removed.

Though the thantri had signed another mahazar on July 19 regarding the handing over of the gilded sheets from dwarapalaka idols, the mahazar was prepared in accordance with the Travancore Devaswom Board's official decision to hand over the artefacts to Potti, the order said. This, the court said, in the absence of any other incriminating circumstances, was also not a ground to implicate the thantri in the case.
